<sup>1</sup> Family's that have a second child attending the College will automatically have a 10% discount applied to their Tuition fees. If a third child attends the College, a 35% discount will automatically apply.

<sup>2</sup> The school building levy at Southern Cross Catholic College is billed to the eldest child attending Systemic Schools. It is a compulsory levy and therefore is not tax deductible.

<sup>3</sup> 'Provide First Aid' Certificates are billed at the beginning of the year as part of the excursion incursion fee. The accredited certificate course, 'Provide First Aid' is compulsory for all SCCC Year 11 students, undertaken in Term 4.

<sup>4</sup> Beauty and Hairdressing Kits are specific course requirements and are procured by the College to supply to students. The charges for these items will be billed with the initial billing. NOTE: Items purchased for Year 11 courses should be retained for use in Year 12. No refunds can be given on these items for health and hygiene reasons.

## School Fee Payment Methods

An annual statement will be issued in February (Term 1), with reminders in Term 2, 3 and 4 on balances owing.

Where students join the school during the school year, a pro rata account for fees will be arranged.

Payment of fees can be made by lump sum, or by consistent regular smaller payments.

- The preferred method of payment is by BPay. The biller code and reference number are shown on the monthly fee statements. It is important that the correct reference number is entered.
- Credit card payments can be made over the phone or online in Compass.
- Cash, and or card payments can be made at the College office.
- There are also facilities to make smaller, more regular payments by using:
  - (i) A Credit Card Standing Authority (form available from the office)
  - (ii) Direct payments can be arranged from any Centrelink benefits that a family may receive using the fortnightly Centrepay system
  - (iii) BPay payments can be made at regular intervals using the biller code and reference number shown on the fee statements.

Families unable to meet fee payment schedules must contact the Business Manager, in advance, at the start of the year to discuss an alternative payment plan.

The Catholic Education Foundation (CEF) has three Bursary programs. If you have financial hardship, are Indigenous, a Foster Parent/Carer, or Refugee, you may be eligible to apply. Detailed CEF Bursary application forms are available from the Business Manager.

Other Catholic families who may be experiencing a period of financial difficulty are asked to complete an Application for Financial Assistance which can be obtained from the Business Manager. Please always advise the Business Manager if your situation changes during the course of the year.

## Essential PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)

### Required Personal Protective Equipment

**Construction, Furniture Making and Automotive** - Students are required to wear a long sleeve high visibility cotton shirt.

Steel-capped boots are compulsory and can be purchased from Ambassador, Kmart or disposal stores. Safety glasses, ear plugs and dust masks will be supplied by the College.

**Early Childhood Education & Care** - An apron is required for practical work.

**SLR (Sport, Lifestyle & Recreation) & Sport Coaching** - The College polo shirt & shorts and / or tracksuit, (dependent on weather conditions) are required to be worn for these courses. Appropriate sport lace-up shoes are also required. Sport Caps are optional for students and can also be purchased from Ambassador.

**Hospitality Courses** - Students are required to wear the following - Black Long Sleeve Chef Jacket, Black Chef Pants, Black Two Pocket  $\frac{3}{4}$  Apron and a Black Chef Skull Cap.

**Entertainment Course** - Students are required to have a pair of black jeans, black enclosed shoes and a black short sleeve polo shirt. The polo shirt can be purchased from Ambassador via the above link. Jeans and shoes can be obtained from various outlets.
